APPLICATION GUIDELINES FOR INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL GRANTS FOR STUDENTS

1. Students may apply for funds to offset the cost of transportation to educational programs overseas. The amount of the grant will not exceed the cost of the international transportation. The maximum award is \$1,000.00. **Depending upon the availability of funds, partial awards may be made.**
2. Educational travel is limited to overseas programs (including Canada, Mexico, Alaska and Hawaii) for which academic credit is earned. The program must last at least 14 days.
3. Students become eligible for a travel award after completing two years of full-time study at Centenary College, or at the end of their sophomore year, whichever comes first. Transfer students must complete at least one full year of study at Centenary College by the beginning of program abroad in order to qualify.
4. To be eligible for a travel grant, the applicant must be in good academic standing. This requires a cumulative GPA of 2.0.
5. When funds are limited, priority will be given to students applying for programs administered by Centenary College, including academic year student exchange programs, overseas modules, and international study tours.
6. Students may receive only one international travel grant during their academic career.
