CALL-IN/WALK-IN SCHEDULING: Tuesday, July 15 - Thursday, July 17 from 9:00-12:00 & 1:00-4:00 only.

Centenary Square, Department of Education (869-5223)

Currently enrolled students or new students who have already submitted all proper credentials may call Ilka (869-5223) **and schedule their classes over the phone.**

We encourage students to do Call-In/Walk-In scheduling. This does not obligate you, but makes Registration a much easier process. If you do Call-In/Walk-In scheduling, you must still come to Registration/Validation Tuesday, August 12 - Thursday, August 14 to complete the registration process.

Each parish is now handling Teacher Tuition Exemption. If you have been approved for Tuition Exemption you must pay Centenary for your class. The parish will then pay Centenary College at the end of the semester, and Centenary will reimburse you.

REGISTRATION: Tuesday, August 12 - Thursday, August 14 from 2:00-4:00 only. You must first come to Centenary Square, Department of Education, to pick up your schedule, sign a release/address form, receive parking information, and petition for Comps if you are completing your M.Ed. degree. If you are completing your M.A.T. degree, you will need to fill out a graduation form. Please note that **all** M.Ed. and M.A.T. students must go to www.centenary.edu and under Campus Services/Registrar's page, fill out a graduation form. **This must be done by September of the academic year in which you are to graduate.** If you fail to fill out the form (**properly**), your diploma will not be ordered.

LATE REGISTRATION: Monday, August 25, 2008 from 1:00 to 4:00 only.

Students who do not register August 12, 13, or 14 may participate in Late Registration providing classes are still open. **You must first come to the Department of Education to pick up your schedule and then proceed to the Business Office. There will be a late fee of \$100.00.**

COST: \$525.00 per three-hour class

ATTENTION: New students (Degree & Non-Degree) who plan to enroll for the Fall session MUST submit the following items to the Department of Education by August 1, 2008. **UNLESS THE FOLLOWING ITEMS HAVE BEEN SUBMITTED BY THE AUGUST 1 DEADLINE, YOU WILL NOT BE ABLE TO REGISTER. NEW STUDENTS WILL NOT BE ADMITTED THE DAY OF REGISTRATION/VALIDATION. RETURNING STUDENTS WHO HAVE NOT ATTENDED FOR (FIVE) YEARS MUST FOLLOW THE SAME GUIDELINES.**

Two official transcripts from **all** universities attended (sent directly to the Department of Education, and must have a 2.5 overall GPA).

\$35.00 non-refundable application fee.

Official NTE/PRAXIS Scores and a certification plan on file.

Proof of Immunization Compliance.

CLASSES END: Friday, December 12, 2008

ID CARDS:

IMPORTANT:

If Fall 2008 is your last semester needed for a certification or a degree, you are strongly encouraged to select your classes during the Call-In/Walk-In scheduling period, to hold a place for yourself. That is, if you do not participate in Call-In scheduling, and the class you need to complete your degree is already filled at Registration, you must wait until it is offered again (which may be as long as a year later) to enroll in it.

REMINDER:

Students who do not attend registration/validation will be dropped from the course(s) they requested during Call In/Walk In Scheduling. You may come to late registration but the course(s) you want may be full. Also if you by-pass the Education Department during registration/validation or during late registration, and go directly to the Business Office (as some students have) you will be dropped from your course(s).
