

Dear [student name],

You have likely heard that the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act passed in late March has provided Higher Education Emergency Relief Funds to help students cover expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to the COVID-19 pandemic. These funds are designed to replace stimulus funds from the IRS that were not made available to traditional-age college students.

Because you are over the age of 23 and/or married, you should have qualified for the \$1,200-\$2,400 stimulus grant from the IRS. Centenary will be distributing its share of CARES Act grants to students who did not qualify for the IRS stimulus grant.

I know that this spring has been a time of disruption and uncertainty for you and for all of our students, but we have been impressed by your resilience and flexibility and are proud to have you as members of the Centenary community.
