

Dear [student name],

Centenary has received Higher Education Emergency Relief Funds from the CARES Act to help students cover expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Department of Education has specified that these funds should only go to students who are eligible for Title IV funds. Most students who have previously filed the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) are eligible to receive these funds. Centenary's Office of Financial Aid has communicated with students who do not currently have a FAFSA on file and encouraged them to do so immediately.

CARES ACT grants will range from \$200 to \$1,000, depending on Pell eligibility and whether students remained on campus when the College moved to remote instruction. A full breakdown of categories is available at the bottom of this email. **Please be aware that these grant funds are separate from any refunds that the College will provide for room and board.**

You will receive email confirmation of your amount next week, and can expect to receive a check no later than May 15. If you have any questions regarding your grant, please send an email to cefg@centenary.edu.
