

## CRRSAA Messages

### Web Message

Centenary has received Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) funds to help students. The CRRSAA requires that institutions prioritize students with exceptional need.

Centenary is using the Expected Family Contribution (EFC) as determined by the FAFSA as an indicator of need. Only students with an EFC of less than \$25,000 will receive a grant. Students who are older than 27 should have received an IRS stimulus payment and thus will not receive this CRRSAA Grant.

CRRSAA grants will range from \$500 to \$1,500, depending on Pell Grant eligibility and EFC as determined by the FAFSA. A full breakdown of categories is available below. Students who are enrolled less than full time will receive a prorated grant.
